COUNCIL MEMBER TURNER PROVIDES SUPPORT TO GREENBELT ARTS CENTER

Turner provides funding to assist Greenbelt Arts Center in Restroom Renovation

Council Member Ingrid M. Turner, District 4 (D) supports the Greenbelt Arts Center by presenting a grant award of \$2,500 for the Restroom Rescue Project.

The grant award will assist in the renovation of the restrooms to be more accessible to patrons, actors and people with disabilities.

Council Member Turner stressed the importance of support of the project. "This project addresses the renovation of 17-year old restroom facilities. It is very important to ensure that the patrons of the Greenbelt Arts Center have restrooms that are modern and equipped for use by individuals with disabilities. I encourage all members of the Greenbelt community to support this project."

Joan Jacobs, Chair of the Restroom Rescue project, is grateful to Council Member Turner for her support of the project. "The Restroom Rescue Committee of the Greenbelt Arts Center is thrilled to have received a grant of \$2,500 from the District 4 Fund through the good office of Prince George's Council Member Ingrid M. Turner, a longtime supporter of its theater. The restrooms are presently in very poor condition, so there is a strong sense of urgency for their renovation. Equally important is the desire and the need to make our restrooms accessible to the disabled members of our community, not only to attend performances but to be able to participate in their production. Without bathrooms, the theater cannot function. We are, therefore, most grateful to Council Member Turner and the District 4 Fund for this marvelous contribution."

The Greenbelt Arts Center is located at 123 Centerway in the Roosevelt Center, Greenbelt and is a "black box" Community Theater known for high-quality shows that showcase the experience and talents of their performers and crews, who manage to fit their love of the performing arts into their busy lives.
